New Name and New Director at Jonesboro Arkansas



In recognition of a \$5 million contribution by First National Bank to the Red Wolves Foundation, the fundraising arm of Arkansas State University Athletics, the University Board of Trustees voted on October 19, 2017 to rename the university's multi-purpose facility known as the Convocation Center to "First National Bank Arena."

Also recently announced was the appointment of James W. (Jim) Brown, CFE as the director of the First National Bank Arena. For the past 18 years he has been associated with the Ervin J. Nutter Center at Wright State University, serving since 2010 as executive director of the facility, which is one of the top-ranked university venues in the country. His first day in the new position at A-State was Monday, Oct. 23.

"We will continue to work very hard to bring the highest quality of family entertainment and national touring artists to First National Bank Arena," said Brown. "This building has a well-established reputation in the industry. I look forward to continuing the diversified entertainment and enhancing the quality of life for Northeast Arkansas."

First National Bank's naming rights will extend through the next 12 years, as announced at a press conference Oct. 19. The gift guarantees the naming rights through Dec. 31, 2029.

"First National Bank has always been committed to supporting the communities we serve, and I couldn't think of a better way to do that than partnering with Arkansas State University," said Will Brewer, vice chairman of First National Bank. "The Convocation Center has a long history of providing great experiences to families across the state, and First National Bank has a long history of serving families in this area."

"This is a great opportunity to do something together to serve the people of Northeast Arkansas. Naming the First National Bank Arena provides us with an opportunity to support our local university while also giving us the ability to tell people about our great organization."

First National Bank was founded in 1889 and has 14 locations across Arkansas. With \$1.3 billion in total assets, the bank is among only 5% of financial institutions in the nation to receive a 5-star rating from Bauer Financial for over 27 years running.

"Like the Convocation Center itself, First National Bank has been a major presence in our region for many years and so it is only fitting that our magnificent facility bear the First National name," said Arkansas State University System President Dr. Chuck Welch. "A-State is extremely grateful to the bank for their generosity and significant support. This is certainly a very exciting day for our university and community."

The Arkansas-based bank is the first donor of any kind to have naming rights for the 207,507 square-foot facility that opened in 1987 as the Convocation Center. The arena lists official capacity for athletics events as 10,563 and 11,704 for concerts.

The facility's first event was Arkansas State's spring commencement in May 1987, while the first concert was performed by George Strait on July 31, 1987. Over the past 30 years the venue has hosted the biggest names in entertainment including sold-out performances by Garth Brooks, Taylor Swift, Alan Jackson, Jason Aldean, Reba McEntire, Eric Church and most recently Luke Bryan as part of the building's 30th Anniversary Celebration on Feb. 18, 2017.

Henry B. Gonzalez Convention Center Expansion receives LEED Certification for Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design



The Henry B. González Convention Center (HBGCC) has received the Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) Silver Certification from the U.S. Green Building Council (USGBC). The HBGCC achieved LEED Silver certification for implementing practical and measurable strategies and solutions aimed at achieving high performance in: innovative design, sustainable site development, water savings, energy efficiency, materials selection and indoor environmental quality.

“From the beginning of this project, our goal has been to ensure that the transformation of the Henry B. González Convention Center was more than just adding square footage,” said Michael Sawaya, Executive Director of Convention and Sports Facilities for the City of San Antonio. “From having the largest ballroom in Texas to achieving LEED Silver Certification, this monumental project has been on the leading edge of innovation in our industry,” Sawaya added.

The \$325 million expansion marks the largest single capital improvement project in the City of San Antonio’s history and increases the Henry B. Gonzalez Convention Center footprint to 1.65 million square feet. This innovative design-build project was delivered by the City of San Antonio ahead of schedule and within budget.


The convention center expansion included more than 800,000 square feet of new construction and more than 78,000 square feet that was renovated within the existing building. The expansion comprises 260,000 square feet of new exhibition space, along with a 54,000 square foot ballroom, making the Henry B. Gonzalez Convention Center the largest of its kind in Texas.

“The City of San Antonio is proud to be a catalyst for positive change in the way our buildings are constructed and operated,” said Douglas Melnick, Chief Sustainability Officer for the City of San Antonio. “San Antonio is truly moving onward and upward, accelerating change and embracing the implementation of the SA Tomorrow Sustainability Plan.”

“The HBGCC LEED certification demonstrates tremendous green building leadership,” said Mahesh Ramanujam, President and CEO, USGBC. “LEED was created to make the world a better place and revolutionize the built environment by providing everyone with healthy, green and high performing buildings. The HBGCC serves as a prime example of how the work of innovative building projects can use local solutions to make a global impact on the environment.”


