Incident Summary:

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) is closely monitoring an outbreak of respiratory illness caused by a novel (new) coronavirus (termed "2019-nCoV") that was first detected in Wuhan City, Hubei Province, China and which continues to expand. Five cases of Novel Coronavirus (nCoV) confirmed in the United States (U.S.) with 2,014 confirmed worldwide.

Commercial Facilities

(Outdoor Events)

The Walt Disney Company along with local partners of Disneyland Hong Kong and Disneyland Shanghai have closed operations indefinitely in consideration for the health and safety of their guests.

Healthcare and Public Health:

Illnesses range from little to no symptoms to being severely ill and dying with 80 deaths reported in China. The CDC has developed a real time test which can diagnose the virus from clinical specimens. While there is no vaccine available for the Novel Coronavirus, the CDC recommends flu vaccinations and preventive actions such as washing your hands often, avoid close contact with people who are sick and stay home when sick.

Transportation Systems

(Aviation)

The CDC and Customs and Border Protection (CBP) have implemented “enhanced health screening” for airline passengers arriving from the Wuhan province of China. Five U.S. airports of entry—Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport (ATL), Chicago O’Hare International Airport (ORD), Los Angeles (LAX), San Francisco (SFO) and New York (JFK) have begun screening international travelers.

CDC Screening entails identifying those arriving from Wuhan, China along with presented indicators:

Fever, i.e., person feels warm to the touch, gives a history of feeling feverish, or has an actual measured temperature of 100.4° F (38° C) or higher, OR

Persistent cough or difficulty breathing.

On January 23, 2020, CDC raised its travel alert for the coronavirus outbreak. The CDC travel health notice for Wuhan (level 3, avoid non-essential travel) was expanded to include all of Hubei Province, China. In addition, the State Department Travel Advisory was raised to Level 4 -Do not travel to Hubei province, China.
